


BIG RED HEN AND THE LITTLE LOST EGG

DID YOU KNOW?

Many stories we read have little teaching moments in them about feelings, belonging or simply facts on animals or places. Take the time when reading stories like this one, talk to your child about how it feels to be loved and to love someone or you might talk about all the different animals that come from eggs and look some up at the library next time you visit. Every new book is an adventure, enjoy the ride!



Sitting together look and talk about the cover picture and the big red hen and little lost egg

Talk with your child about all the kinds of animals that you know that come from eggs.

Read the story aloud, point to the different kinds of birds that are mentioned. You might like to stop and count them or look at what makes them different.

As each of the birds guesses what is in the egg, encourage your child to think of something that could be in the egg.

Talk about how the hen felt when she found it was a hen chick in the egg, was she happy or sad? Happy. You could relate this back to a time your child found something or was surprised by something, and felt happy.

Ask your child to retell the story to you in their own words, it is really amazing to hear what they remember and which parts were really important to them.
